HOW TO RECYCLE!

PAPER PRODUCTS: Place all paper products in a clear plastic bag.

- Office Forms
- Carbonless Paper
- Colored Paper
- Copy Machine Paper
- Letterhead and Stationary
- Typing Paper and Index Cards
- Phones Message and Post-it Notes
- Manila File Folders
- Glossy Paper and Magazines

The average person generates over 4 pounds of trash every day and about 1.5 tons of solid waste per year.

NEWSPAPER and PHONEBOOKS: Place in a clear plastic bag.

CANS AND ALUMINUM: Rinse container & remove caps. Labels okay. Put in clear plastic bag.

PLASTIC: #1- #7 plastic bottles. Rinse container & remove caps. Place in a clear plastic bag.

CARDBOARD: Corrugated Cardboard: Break down. Can be free-floating.

Cardboard from items like cereal boxes must be placed in a clear plastic bag.

INK CARTRIDGES, BATTERIES, CELL PHONES, CAPS FROM PLASTIC (for art):

These items can be recycled inside of both schools. Please share them with us.

WE DO NOT RECYCLE THESE ITEMS:

Blueprint and/or Waxed Paper, Grocery or Lunch Bags, Glue Bound Books or Reports, Styrofoam, Glass, Soiled Items

NOTE: No rubber bands, staples or metal fasteners such as Spiral Binders.

Paper Clips are okay.
